Summer Film Institute

Become a director, set designer, writer, or videographer with these four new and exciting programs for summer 2010. Presented by the Association for Visual Arts (AVA) and Baylor School, these enrichment programs will introduce you to the art of film making! These four, week-long sessions will focus on 2-D animation (week 1), 3-D animation (week 2), short narrative video (week 3), and creating a music video (week 4). These classes take place on Baylor's campus and with expert instruction by AVA artists.

Session 1/June 7-11 2-D Animation/Ages 12-17 Eric Keller

This session will focus on 2-D stop motion animation techniques. All equipment, art supplies, digital cameras, and computer technology will be provided by Baylor School and AVA. Students will work in teams to create their own animated movie, and the week will culminate in a mini film festival with a premiere of the finished work for family and friends.

Session 2/June 14-18 3-D Animation/Ages 12-17 Jim Alverson

This session will focus on 3-D clay sculpture animation techniques. The camp will provide the opportunity for students to explore animation, visual literacy, editing, special effects techniques, and multimedia concepts.

Session 3/June 21-25 Short Video 101/Ages 12-17 Emily Bowman

"From Script to Screen: Making a Short Video" will focus on writing, directing, and editing a video short. This class will introduce participants to the process of getting a short video made, from the idea phase, through production and editing, post-production, and beyond.

Session 4/June 28-July 2 Music Video 101/Ages 12-17 Jon-Michael Brown

Learn how to create a music video from start to finish. Lighting, sound, sets and videography are just a few of the areas students will explore in this one-week class dedicated to making a music video.

Summer Art Camp

Drawing, painting, sculpture, collage and printmaking are just a few of the exciting art activities children will experience this summer. AVA's Art Camp offers weeklong, in-depth classes led by professional artists that cover a range of topics in 2-D and 3-D art. A variety of age-appropriate classes (ages 4-5, 6-7, 8-9, 10-11), each with a different focus, are offered throughout the summer.

Session 1/June 7-11 Creature Features/Ages 10-11 Doug Boals/Stacy Alverson

Using cardboard boxes, found objects and paint, children will create animal totems and explore various painting and printmaking techniques.

Session 2/June 14-18 Picture This/Ages 8-9 Eric Keller/Stacy Alverson

Using painting, collage and printmaking techniques, children will explore the art of portraits as well as create stories through visual art.

Session 3/June 21-25 Expressions and Impressions/Ages 6-7 Kimmerlen Moore/Doug Boals

Children will learn about the magic of color, collage, painting and found-object sculpture.

Session 4/June 28-July 2 Mini Masters/Ages 4-5 Anna Louise Haynes Myers

Children will be introduced to various master artists throughout history and will get a chance to create their own masterpieces.

Session 5/July 12-16 Don't Fence Me In/Ages 10-11 Kimmerlen Moore/Dennis Palmer

Participants will learn creative strategies to express themselves through painting, sculpture, collage and assemblage.

Session 6/July 19-23 Who Am I? An Artist!/Ages 8-9 Sarah Cardillo Nichols/Jake Kelly

Utilizing printmaking and painting techniques, children will learn about color and composition by illustrating their imagination.

Session 7/July 26-30 Combo Critters/Ages 6-7 Anna Louise Haynes Myers/Dennis Palmer

Using paint, printmaking, sculpture and collage, children will use their imagination to create unique creatures to tell a story through art.

Session 8/August 2-6 The World All Around/Ages 4-5 Maria Cardillo

Children will explore their world and the universe through color, collage, sculpture and paint. By the end of the week, participants will have a vast array of creative experiments that give a voice to their vision.

AVA Art Camp is held at the Ireland Fine Arts Center located at Baylor School in Chattanooga.

Enrollment is limited to 15 participants per session.

Early registration is encouraged to ensure space in the program of your choice. Lunch will be provided throughout the week. Pre-registration is necessary.

Registration begins January 1 and ends May 15.
